



ADDITIONAL POLICIES REGARDING SCHOOL UNIFORMS AND OUT-OF-UNIFORM DAYS

OUT-OF-UNIFORM DAYS

There are a number of out-of-uniform days throughout the school year. The school administration reserves the right to provide something for students to wear when students are dressed inappropriately/immodestly for out-of-uniform days.

DRESS-UP DAYS

- NOT ALLOWED: shorts, jeans, sweat pants, t-shirts, sweatshirts.

ALL OTHER OUT-OF-UNIFORM DAYS

- ALLOWED FOR GIRLS & BOYS: jeans provided they are not ripped or torn.
- ALLOWED FOR GIRLS & BOYS: shorts. The length of girls' shorts must be at least to the finger tips when the arms are at a person's side. The length of boys' shorts may be no longer than mid-calf. NO sagging is allowed.
- ALLOWED FOR GIRLS: capris, skirts/skorts. The length of girls' skirts/skorts must be at least to the finger tips when the arms are at a person's side.
- ALLOWED FOR GIRLS & BOYS: sweatshirts and t-shirts provided that they have **NO** inappropriate/obscene/drug/alcohol related sayings or pictures.
- ALLOWED FOR GIRLS: sleeveless tops & camisoles under other tops.
- NOT ALLOWED FOR GIRLS: spaghetti strap tops, midriff tops, tube tops, & half-shirts. Stomach and back must be completely covered.
- NOT ALLOWED FOR BOYS: muscle shirts, sleeveless shirts, or half shirts.
- NOT ALLOWED FOR BOYS OR GIRLS: pajama style and/or flannel pants, basketball/athletic shorts, sweat pants, Under Armour shirts.
- ALLOWED: flip-flops and crocs.
- NOT ALLOWED: Heelies/Wheelies.
- Socks are optional.

SCOUTS

Students who are in Scouts may wear their Scout uniforms to school on Scout meeting days.

CHARITABLE WALKS/RACES

Students who participate in a walk or race for a charitable cause may be out of uniform the following school day if they wear the t-shirt or sweatshirt from the event. Students should get a permission form from the office on that day.

JEWELRY, MAKE-UP & HAIR

The following are not allowed either on regular uniform or out-of-uniform days:

- Inappropriate or excessive jewelry. This includes heavy chains, dog collars and items that are potentially dangerous. Earrings may be worn in ears only (not in eyebrows, nose, mouth, lip, etc.)
- Inappropriate or heavy makeup.
- Inappropriate hair coloring and styling.

The school administration will determine what is inappropriate.
